Goal

- Introduce some questions (sometimes some solutions too) in economics of networks and of the Internet

Grading

Students presentations & abstracts

- By groups of 3, choose a paper in the list on the website
 - Send me the groups with 3 selected papers ranked by preference by Dec. 14, 12:00pm
- Read carefully the paper to understand it perfectly
 - (That might require reading other sources!)
- Prepare:
 - By group: a 25 min presentation on the topic of the paper (TBD given the number of groups)
 - The presentation will be followed by questions
 - Individually: a 2-pages abstract of the paper
- Although the presentations are prepared by groups, each student must be ready to present everything
 - I reserve the right to decide randomly at the last minute who presents
- Student presentations will take place on Jan 25 or Feb 14, afternoon
- Send me by email, before the presentations start
 - The presentation slides (one file per group)
 - The abstracts (one file per student)

Some general advice for abstracts/presentations

- The papers given are hard
- They will require to look at other papers to be fully understood (excuses such as “we have not seen that in class” will **not** be accepted)
 - Research!
- Read them early
- Search for additional references
- Ask questions early

Grading criteria

 - Quality of the synthesis
 - Clarity
 - Presentation
 - Understanding
- Presentations:
 - Clarity, quality of the slides and presentation
 - Ability to extract the most important aspects
 - Pedagogy
 - Understanding
 - Answer to questions
